

Handwerker Gallery Exhibits: *Batik Futuriste!* and *Well Worn*

Solo exhibitions by Toby Barnes and Katarina Riesing both feature works created using a batik process, which employs the use of wax-resistant dye on fabric. While they share the use of this process in common, their works couldn't be more different. Barnes's show, *Batik Futuriste*, focuses on autobiographical themes through works that have a graphic sensibility inspired by contemporary and traditional Asian iconography, textiles, and spiritual practices. Riesing's show, *Well Worn*, includes a suite of at times provocative works that are both intimate in scale and subject matter.



General Information

Emergencies

In the event of an emergency on campus, contact the Office of Public Safety. The communications center is operational and staffed at all times (24 hours per day, year-round) and can be reached by dialing 911 from any campus phone or by dialing (607) 274-3333. Additionally, emergency phones are strategically located throughout the campus and are readily identifiable (by a blue light), offering immediate and direct contact with the Office of Public Safety.

Parking

Parking is permitted in all lots with the exception of P lot, closest to the Peggy Ryan Williams Center. Parking passes are not required for Family Weekend. Please note that emergency vehicles must have immediate access to all buildings at all times. Improperly parked vehicles present hardships for emergency response and pose a real threat to public safety. As such, Ithaca College must respond to traffic infractions that impede emergency access such as parking in fire lanes, loading docks, walkways, sidewalks, or

other non-designated parking areas and spaces. In the interest of public safety, improperly parked vehicles may result in the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.

Pets

The college does not permit pets on campus with the exception of service animals. Families are requested not to bring pets of any kind.

Recreational Vehicles

Health regulations prohibit self-contained trailers and/or recreational vehicles from parking overnight on campus. Area campsite information is available from the Office of Conference and Event Services, (607) 274-3313. Address additional questions to Parking and Traffic Services, (607) 274-3756.

Cameras and recording equipment are forbidden in our theaters and auditoriums in accordance with section 31.01 of the New York State Arts and Cultural Affairs Law. Seating will begin 20 minutes before the start of each performance.
